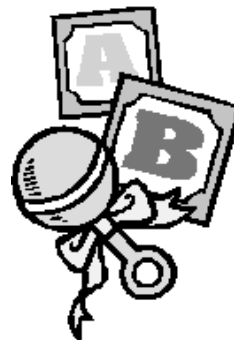


The Hill's Chapel House Call July 2011

ICE CREAM SOCIAL!!!!

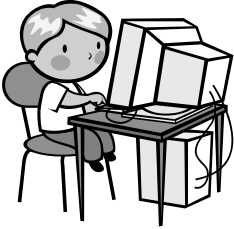
July 24th at 5:00 pm

Way to Go, Hill's Chapel and Catawba Springs Elementary!!!

What a wonderful surprise on Sunday, June 12th when Pastor Val opened a letter from The Duke Endowment informing us that Hill's Chapel had been awarded a \$30,000 grant for use with Catawba Springs Elementary over the next three years. Three years ago we had been given \$5000 to use for the food program so when Val informed me that we could again apply, I decided to give it a chance. I also met with principal Kristi Smith to see exactly what the school needs most. With Val's assistance I wrote the

grant and requested a total of \$33,000 for three years, thinking there was no way we would get anywhere near this amount. In April a Duke Endowment representative interviewed us, checked out our facilities and asked many, many questions about statistics and needs at the school. She also wanted to make sure that the church members were invested in this program. Much to our surprise we were granted the \$30,000 at \$10,000 a year.

I would like to explain the grant so that there are no questions about how the money will be spent, and to encourage our continued generous support of this program. We still definitely need that support! There are so many hungry people right here in our community! The terms of the grant also require that the church assume at least half of the costs associated with the program—and this program gets very expensive through the course of the year. Only through the support of our members and the PTA can we make this happen.

The purpose of the grant is: to provide various programs for the Catawba Springs Elementary School feeder area that will encourage higher education achievement and will help alleviate hunger issues. It is divided into three main sections:

- Backpack program
- Afterschool program
- Summer enrichment program

BACKPACK/HUNGER PROGRAM

The grant money supports our goals and extends our reach. We were able to write in some funding to continue the food program in the summer so the children do not go hungry while they are not in school. Another expenditure from this part of the grant will be for our church to sponsor at least two Second Harvest Ministry trucks at East Lincoln Christian Ministries. These events occur four times a year and the local churches sponsor and work the program. Each truck cost \$300 so we will pay for two and encourage the other churches in the area to help us work at the events.

AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM

Once the second semester starts at Catawba Springs, the teachers begin to identify the students who need remediation and one-on-one instruction before they take the North Carolina End of Grade tests in May. These students stay after school two days a week for eleven weeks and the teachers are funded through federal government Title I monies. This program is only for 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. Our church has been furnishing snacks for these children for three years and our new grant will allow us to do that again. In addition this grant will allow the students in grades K, 1st and 2nd to get this same remediation for one day a week. We will pay the teachers a stipend and pay for any materials and equipment needed to provide this extra instruction. And of course we will get the younger children a snack for each session.

SUMMER ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Again this summer we will host a four day summer school for any child at the school who wants to attend but especially for those who need some remediation during the 10 weeks they are out of school. This helps the teachers to do less review at the first of the year so that they can jump right in with new instruction. Last year we had approximately 60 students attend with 7 teachers helping them. Our church members provided snacks for them for four days and a hot dog lunch on the last day. This year we will provide them a light breakfast so we are sure they are getting a good start to their day. Next year we hope to extend the time to include lunch every day.

In order to provide the most up-to-date instruction for all the children at the school we will be purchasing some new technological equipment for the teachers to use throughout the school year, starting with the summer school camp. This equipment will be used with the new SmartBoards that the school was able to purchase with the proceeds from the golf tournament.

Again I need to emphasize the importance of all church members in supporting each part of our endeavor with the school. These children are our future so we all have a stake in their learning process. We know that unless these students are well nourished and cared for they will not learn like they should. And as much as we don't want to admit it, it takes all of us to raise these children into the adults we need them to be. Please continue your generous donations of food and/or designated checks.

Please join me in thanking The Duke Endowment and our heavenly Father for such a wonderful opportunity to serve these children. Come spend one hour with these little ones and you'll be as excited as I am about this excellent opportunity we have before us.

Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

There's a movement afoot, it seems. Things--kingdom things???. coming together around a common theme:

- 1) Visioning: Church Coach Dave Zeitlow met with Hill's Chapel folks two evenings in June to invite us into a four-part process of discerning where we are and where we're going. Our great strength, and great passion, as a congregation is MISSION. We will build on that strength.
- 2) We've just finished a short Bible Study called *Change the World*. It invites churches to go back to our earliest roots as Christians. What distinguishes, or marks, Christians? Mission.
- 3) We received a 3-year, \$30,000 grant from The Duke Endowment to continue and build upon our relationship with Catawba Springs Elementary. This school--right here in our community--has tremendous needs itself, and so do many of the students there. Our partnership will help these children get to a level playing field by providing basics: food, clothing, education, a person who demonstrates that they are lovable and worthy.
- 4) The Department of Social Services has been operating out of the church house basement for about three years. They've worked with foster situations there. Now, this month, they will provide an on-site worker to help any member of the community access any necessary services. Initially they'll be here one day a week, then more as need dictates. They will be here on Wednesdays from 1-5 pm.

It's an exciting time in the life of our church and the United Methodist Church. We have great opportunities to work with, partner with, witness with so many different people! The last paragraph of *Change the World* begins this way: "Jesus didn't come so that we might be inspired to live a little better life or to get us into heaven. He came to get heaven into us." Our path is before us now--the path to the kingdom, through the kingdom.
